Will of Nellie P. Dannials

The will of Nellie P. Dannials, who died at Forest Grove January 13, has been filed for probate. It was made January 2 of this year, and directs that her body be buried in the family lot in Union cemetery with a little expense and ostentation as possible. To the husband, John Dannials, is bequeathed a tract of 160 acres of timber land in Crook county, on condition that he waive curtesy rights in other property. In case he declines the land is to be sold and the price be applied to the payment of other legacies and debts. The will declares that Vera L. Campbell, aged 18; Alice M. Campbell, aged 9, and Porter Campbell, aged 4, are testator's only children and heirs. To Vera L. Campbell is bequeathed a piano, under certain conditions, and to Alice M. Campbell deceased's gold watch and jewelry, and the will directs that pictures and wearing apparel be divided between the two. Vera Campbell is given \$350 and Porter Campbell 73 acres of land in the Buxton donation land claim. To Alice Campbell is given \$2,000, which she is to receive when she is 18 years old should she demand it, otherwise this sum is to be paid her by Porter Campbell when he arrives at his majority. Joe A. Wiles is nominated as executor and with Mary Wiles is appointed guardian of the minor heirs.—Hillsboro Independent.
