

"The Mother of the Department"



Among the many distinguished visitors from abroad expected at the W. R. C. encampment here next week, none will be more welcome in Forest Grove than Mrs. Sarah E. Miller, the fourth department president and, in point of years, the oldest living past president of the department of Oregon. Mrs. Miller was for many years a resident of Forest Grove, but is now a resident of Portland, where she attends almost every meeting of the Sumner Corps.

Mrs. Miller was born at Elmira, New York, June 21, 1828, and came to Oregon via Cape

Horn in 1851. She has been a Corps member more than thirty years and has held many important positions, both in the department and corps. She was department president in 1888 and 1889, while a resident of this city and during her term of office visited every corps in the state. The last National Encampment Mrs. Miller attended was the one held at Los Angeles in 1912 and she has attended all but two or three department conventions held in Oregon during the past thirty years.

Mrs. Miller's closest friends lovingly refer to her as "The Mother of the Department."
