**Bean Growers Can Sell Their Own Crops Best**

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, July 10.—Many bean growers of the Willamette Valley and Western Oregon are contracting the sale of their 1917 bean crop on a commission basis. This has come to the attention of Dr. Hector Macpherson, head of rural economics at the Agricultural College, who says that the practice is entirely one-sided and unbusiness-like.

"This one-sided contract," said he after a tour of some of the bean districts of the valley, "guarantees the growers nothing and still they have to pay for it. That is, there is no guarantee that the bean crop will be sold for any more than the grower could get for it—even as much—and a considerable percentage of the market price will go to the selling agencies.

"Although the acreage has been greatly increased in this and other states there is no indication that the price will be forced down. The demand is enormous and continues to grow. For this reason the growers had best keep the marketing in their own hands and get all the profit there is to be made."
