A Meat Substitute

Editor Forest Grove Express,

Dear Sir:

Would you print the following in your columns?

One way we may help in conserving food supplies is by substituting other commodities we have in abundance for those we can ship. Some foods are cheaper than others and still of the same value to the body, so why not use them? Vetch is very abundant in this section and can well be used as a meat substitute; or in other words, as a body-building food.

Try this recipe for baked vetch: Soak vetch 24 hours; cook until tender; place a layer of salt pork in the bottom of the bake dish and fill dish with cooked vetch. Pour over it a small amount of tomato catsup, season with salt and pepper and bake in a moderate oven three or four hours.

Louise Olivereau in Jail

Miss Louise Olivereau, who was employed as a stenographer by different Hillsboro firms a few years ago, was arrested last week in Seattle on charges of being implicated in the treasonable propaganda of the I. W. W., and placed in jail in default of \$7500 bail. This sum is said to be the highest yet imposed on any person arrested under similar charges and indicates the seriousness of the charge. Government officials say Miss Olivereau admits sending out more than 2000 circulars to conscripted men urging them to refuse service under the draft. The arrest was made at the time of simultaneous raids on I. W. W. centers in all states last week. While in Hillsboro Miss Olivereau attracted attention by radical opinions she was in the habit of expressing in public. She was a woman of much intelligence and well educated, but was plainly an extremist. During a political meeting at the court house she attracted attention by questions with which she interrupted the speaker, and these she later wrote out and brought to the Independent with the request that they be published. —Hillsboro Independent.

belongs in the feeble minded institute, says the Hillsboro Independent. The boy is a nephew of George Hart, charged with a criminal attack on McCoy's 12 year old sister, now in the county jail and is said to have been implicated in the alleged crime. He was also charged with setting out fires and other malicious mischief. After a hearing in the county court he was committed to the feeble minded school, but the institution being crowded he was denied admission. A second complaint charging insanity was then filed and he was committed to the asylum, but after a week in that institution was returned to the county. He was placed in the county jail with nine adult prisoners and where there are no facilities for giving him proper care caused much disturbance. He is a son of Mose McCoy, who lives in a wild and thinly settled district in the coast range above Soda Springs. The boy is a cousin of Earl McCoy, convicted of shooting a Portland fisherman named Woodcock from ambush several years ago and who was sent to the reform school.

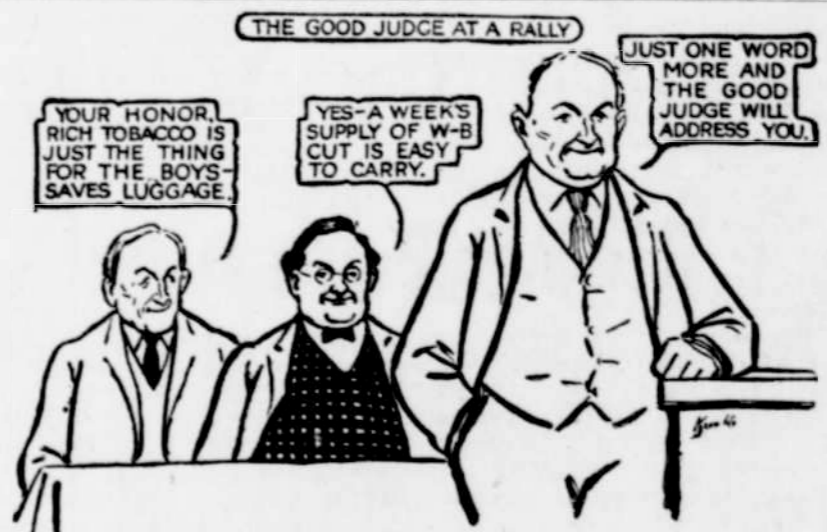
