Treat Potato Seed

Not one potato should be planted this spring without previous treatment with corrosive sublimate, says Prof. M. B. McKay, the potato disease investigator of the Experiment Station at Corvallis. Nearly all potatoes carry the spores of disease-producing fungi on the skin. The simple method of treating the seed potatoes with corrosive sublimate dissolved at the rate of two-thirds in 5 gallons of water will kill these spores. Do not use same solution more than four times as it weakens. Used four times, 5 gals. will treat about 2 bushels. Treat only sound uncut tubers. Treat for one and one half hours. Treat sacks also. Do not use metal container for the solution. Plant in disease free soil that did not grow potatoes the previous year. With proper care and cultivation this will insure a good crop on the right sort of land.
