On Monday Senator Stewart spoke on his resolution, introduced before, to arraign the president for attempting to coerce congress into passing the silver-repeal bill.

In a long speech, he charged that the president, in disregard of his oath of office, allowed the secretary of the treasury to violate the act which made the purchase of 4,500,000 ounces of silver per month mandatory.

"You have overstepped the mark; we cannot afford to have the laws of congress disregarded."
