One of the New York democratic papers recently made an estimate on the basis of the changes MR. GLADSTONE AND THE TEA POI shown in the elections of the past four months from the figures of the canvass of 1892 that the republican lead in the next house of representatives would be in the neighborhood of eighty. Republicans are disposed to place their probable lead at 90 or 100, or about the same as the democratic margin in the present house. However, a lead of eighty, or even of forty, would do until it could be nercased in 1896.

Missouri, for example, is given four republicans in This will be a gain of two for the republicans from the present representation, and it is altogether reasonable to suppose that they will "pull up" to this extent. Dlinois, according to this calculation, will elect is only three more than she chose in 1892. Kansas is given four republicans, three pepulists and one democrat. Most persons will think that this estimate is too favorable to both democrats and populists. No democrats in that state look for the election of any congressman by their party in Kansas this year, and very few populists in the state expect that three of their side will be chosen. After looking over the colonel's figures by states the average intelligent person would be strongly disposed to put the republican lead in the country as a whole higher than Globe-Democrat.
