MARKET GARDEN PRODUCTS.

To the producer of garden vegetables and fruit a very handsome addition to the gross receipts can often be made by retailing direct to consumers. If the articles sold are strictly fresh and reasonably good, there is not the least difficulty in disposing of a number of dollars worth each morning at retail prices. Sometimes, if the produce is of very fine quality, more than retail prices can be obtained. A mixed load of five or six kinds of vegetables is the most profitable, as customers vary from day to day in their wants.

OVER THE STATE.

The salaries of the city officers of Corvallis have been reduced as follows: Chief of Police, from \$60 to \$45 per month; night watch, from \$2 per night to \$1.75; police judge, from \$50 to \$35 per month; city treasurer, from \$20 to \$12 per month.
