per 100 pounds; Cornelius, 9 cents. All other stations in the county, 10 cents. On the Yamhill division, for all stations in the county Tuatlain, Sand Pitt, Sherwood, Middleton and Spaulding Spur, the rate is 8 cents per 100 pounds. The reduction for the 100 pound rate for Hillsboro is nearly or quite as much as for other stations. In class 1 the rate on Portland to Hillsboro has been reduced from 20 cents to 15 cents; 2d, from 18 to 14 cents, and 3d, from 14 to 13 cents. The 4th class is practically reduced to 8 cents, and the 5th class to 7 cents. The rates on all the special class lines for horses and mules in the 1st class are reduced from \$16 to \$14, and cattle, hogs and sheep from \$14 to \$13 per car.
