HONOLULU TURNED OVER TO THE BOYS IN BLUE.

Last Sunday forenoon the cruiser Charleston came into this port from San Francisco. There could be no doubt that her welcome was a hearty one, as it was boisterous.

Wednesday afternoon, late, the transport steamer Australia, City of Peking and City of Sydney arrived at Honolulu. It seems as though the entire populace was at the docks to welcome the ships and the nearly 3000 troops they carried.
