There was opposition to the treaty and the vote demonstrated that it could not have been ratified at this congress but for the savage attack on the American army at Manila last Saturday. The vote as recorded above is only a majority of one and three of these are known to have been changed from the negative to the affirmative.

Some opposition resulted from an honest conviction that the policy of expansion is un-American but most of it arose from a desire to be "for nists" the government. Gorman seems to have intended to put Bryan in a hole but instead is himself in. It is thought now the atmosphere will clear and that the task of governing the Philippines will be much simplified.

The total tax levy for the year in Astoria is 57 mills. It is the largest levy in any town or city in Oregon and comes from assessing property far below its actual value, in order that Astoria taxpayers may escape their just share of the fund that each county contributes to the state. A high levy on a low valuation is much worse for a community from any standpoint than a low levy on a high valuation.

MANILA BATTLE

Fighting Between the Americans and Filipinos

ORDERS TO DEWEY AND OTIS

Officials at Washington have sent them orders to push forward and fight the enemy wherever found

VALOR OF THE VOLUNTEERS

The Volunteers did good work, they were brave and well disciplined. Our casualties are about 250, the enemy's loss reach 4000.

MANILA, Feb. 7.—3:45 P. M.—General Otis, in this dispatch sent, is in complete control of the situation within a radius of nine miles of Manila. The American lines extend to Malabon on the north and to Paraque on the south, fully 25 miles. While a few detached bodies of Filipinos offer desultory opposition, the main body is in full retreat and utterly routed.

The Americans now have a steam-car line to Malabon, and 600 Marines with four Maxim's have been landed from the fleet on the beach north of the city.

Among the important points captured was a strong embraured earthworks within sight of Caloccan.

There was considerable firing from the upper windows of houses in the native quarter of the city last night, but no casualties reported as a result.

The war department has received the following dispatch from Otis: MANILA, Feb. 7.—The insurgent army concentrated around Manila from Luzon province, numbers over 20,000 men, possessing several quick-firing and Krupp field guns. A good portion of the enemy are armed with Mauser's latest pattern gun. Two Krupps and a great many rifles were captured. Insurgents fired a great quantity of ammunition. Quite a number of Spanish soldiers are in the insurgent service, and these serve the artillery.

The insurgents constructed strong intrenchments near our lines, mostly in bamboo thickets. These our men guard, killing or capturing many of the enemy. Our casualties aggregate 49 killed and 149 wounded. The enemy's loss in killed, wounded and prisoners will reach 4000.

PRUNE CULTURE.

At the meeting of the orchardists at Corvallis last week, J. H. Fletcher of Vancouver Washington extended remarks on prune culture and marketing which is reported as follows in the Pacific Farmer, Portland:

J. H. Fletcher said that when he went into business many years ago, he told the nurserymen to send 100 trees, did not care what. Among them were 25 Italian, 25 petite and 50 German prunes, but he now has no use for any except the Italian. He cannot recommend any kind or style of evaporator. He first had a little square frame building with shelves around the sides. He heated with a stove and nearly melted when went inside to look after the fruit. After trying his first output of a few hundred pounds, he took the prunes to McCracken and sold for 8 cents per pound; the next year he sold \$200 worth and was told that he could sell all of that kind of fruit that he could raise. He kept improving until in '87 or '88, the question of dipping with lye began to be agitated and he had found the cracking of the skin is absolutely necessary. Does not lose 1 per cent where before he dipped with lye lost 25 per cent. His doubts about the man who says he has a perfect evaporator. Does not believe that a prune can be dried

perfectly under thirty hours, generally takes from thirty to forty hours. Should have a store room some distance from evaporators because you get away from heat and avoid danger of fire. Spread fruit on floor. Believes that it is better to keep fruit stirred than to throw it in a bin for sweating. Stir prunes at least once a week until dried out and cool. Believes that fruit properly dried will have a bright yellow flesh instead of black. Do not put a prune in a drier until thoroughly ripe. Never shake a tree, it is a damage to you, a damage to the fruit and a damage to the price. He is now seeking an evaporator that will combine economy of fuel and economy of labor. Must pay more attention to the scientific side of fruit drying to enable us to turn out a more perfect fruit. Is not afraid of an over production of Italian prunes. The Italian prune requires a cool, moist atmosphere. In France it grows in a climate similar to that of Oregon. There has been 15 or 20 cars of fruit sent to Europe from Clarke county this year and the finest grades sold as high as 17 cents per pound. With Italian prunes can get larger fruit from the older trees but the older the better the smaller the fruit. Packed entire crop this year in 25 pound boxes and got one-fourth cent more

than if packed in 50 pound boxes. Fruit should never be shipped that is not thoroughly dried. Pits should never roll in a curved prune, should be solid and should securely fill the hands. It is better to put a pound more than one-fourth of a pound less in a box to insure against dockage in the east. It is better for each community to have a good responsible man to act as an agent in preference to unions.
