Gov. W. P. Lord has been appointed minister to Persia with his residence at Teheran. The station is a third class and carries a salary of \$5000. It is not stated whether the Judge will accept or not. The capital is somewhat to one side of the history making places and our representative will have little to do, except to dig among the stories and legends of Assyrian and Babylonian civilizations of early ages.

And, so, Mayor Harrison, of Chicago, is a Bryan democrat, a free silver advocate, a 16 to 1er. Well, perhaps. But Altheide, whose support of the 1896 Chicago platform has never been questioned, opposed Harrison, and the Bryanites condole with Altheide. For what do they do it? The Crokerites of New York congratulate Harrison. Yet these same Crokerites would not let Bryan speak at their Jefferson dinner. The Independent admits that it is not well up in Bryan party management but as one of the common people it does not believe that the Chicago municipal election is in any sense to be taken as a silver victory. In truth it is a silver defeat which will be repeated in 1900.

The U. S. gunboat Yorktown was sent by Admiral Dewey at Balor on the east coast of Luzon. Lt. Gilmore and 14 men started out of the bay up a small stream to communicate with the beleaguered Spanish. When out of sight of the ship they were fired upon by the natives. The boat did not return and a search disclosed neither men nor boat. The fate of these men is unknown. The Yorktown went to the nearest cable station and the nearest cable station was the first men lost by the navy while the army has lost three prisoners. Report says that they are treated fairly well. One promises money for their subsistence. The navy at Washington thinks the Gilmore party may have reached the Spanish garrison and is said to have devised the plan for the rescue or the punishment of the captors.

Notwithstanding what has been said about embalmed beef, charlatans go forward to laud their new fangled preservatives. This week a so-called farm journal comes to hand from Indiana containing an advertisement wherein liquid extract of smoke is lauded. It is applied with a brush. That is just what was done for Miles' embalmed beef at Tampa. This whole miserable business is an attempt on the part of promoters to find some way of suspending the laws of nature. The independent can not conceive an official so base as to deliberately put off upon the army a food totally unfit for use. Packers thought they had it. It was an experiment. A packer had feature is that those same packers will continue to put a product on the market which will be bought by a confident citizenship that has no inspecting officers to protect the rights of the public.

In the town of Dallas in Polk county, there are five moderate manufacturing establishments—saw mill, woolen mill, foundry, tannery and ash and door factory. About \$5000 per month is paid out in wages. The result is that business is good in Dallas, houses all occupied and well kept up, and schools well maintained. What is done in Dallas is done by sheer force of energy and enterprise. The town enjoys no special advantages in the way of transportation, it is not on navigable water; it has no "pull" of any kind. It simply attends to its own business and depends on itself, wasting none of its forces in ambitions and longings for the unattainable. Many a more pretentious and less prosperous town would do well to imitate the local policy of Dallas.—Oregonian. How does this statement of facts strike Hillsboro?

WILL USE THE BAYONET

Last week the governors of South Dakota and Nebraska addressed the war department at Washington demanding the discharge of the volunteers furnished by those states who are now serving with MacAlister and Lawton in the Philippines. The demand is based on the ground that their term of enlistment expired when the ratifications of the peace treaty were exchanged, and that the present conflict in the Philippines is in opposition to liberty and in the interest of capitalism.

The Chicago Tribune recognizing the incident as a political scheme to advance the interests of the anti expansionists desired to know how far the scheme extended and to that end addressed an enquiry to several of the governors in the north-west who

have soldiers at Manila. Gov. Gear of Oregon replied in these ringing words which reflect the sentiment of our people. "There is quite a general wish among the people of Oregon that the volunteer soldiers of the state may soon be returned from Manila, but not for the reason intended by the governors of the states you mention, to-wit: that the present conflict in the Philippines is in opposition to liberty and in the interest of capitalism. "There is some justice in asking for the return of the volunteers, now that the war with Spain, for which they enlisted, has been honorably concluded, and that the spasmodic difficulty yet lingering in the Philippines should be suppressed by the regular army of the United States, which is amply equipped for the purpose. It is believed, however, that this wish is confined to those of us who are at home, as the Oregon boys at the front quite generally express a desire to remain there until the difficulty is settled.

"Our people take no stock in the declaration that the conflict in the Philippines is 'waged in opposition to liberty and in the interest of capitalism.' The very men who make this charge now are the ones who, little more than a year ago, were loudly accusing President McKinley of 'cowardice' and of 'delaying the war with Spain' in the 'interest of capitalism,' as represented by Spanish bond-holders.

"The seizing of the Philippines was an incident of that war wholly unforeseen by anybody, applauded by every patriotic citizen at that time, and they could not now be relinquished without a taint on our national weakness. "The charge that the American flag is waving over a conflict in the Philippines 'in opposition to liberty and in the interest of capitalism' savors very much of the spirit of demagoguery to which a people of Oregon are habitual strangers, and which finds no lodgment in their minds at this time."
