There will be a sociable given by the congregation on the Wednesday evening June 13. The members and friends of the church hope to welcome a large number of guests. Sunday will be observed at Children's Day in the Methodist church. Appropriate services will be held in the morning, and in the evening the children and the young people will render a good program. Everybody will be cordially welcomed. Some alarming reports from the grain fields came in last week to the effect that rust had developed on the wheat but they turned out to be false alarms. The warm sunbath of putting in a proper color on the growing grain, and a satisfactory condition prevails. Mr. M. F. Heidel has a cartload of ash lumber, 11 or 12 thousand, which goes forward to the Oregon furniture manufacturing company at Portland. The lumber was sawed from timber cut along the banks of Dairy creek three or four miles above Hillsboro. The truth of the criticism made by the Independent when the diagonal street was excavated through the street is now realized when the ditchers are excavating across that street. Diagonal planks may be of advantage on bridges where braces are necessary, but for paving it is nuisance. The patrons and friends of the Hillsboro public school are cordially invited to be present at the commencement exercises, which are to be held in the opera house, June 10th, at 8 o'clock p. m. Education teachers from Portland have been preparing the members of the graduating class who take part in the exercises. An excellent program is promised. Mr. J. B. Wilkes did a job of typewriting this week that is not often equaled. He made a table of the election returns by precincts on a sheet of paper 17 by 20 inches in size, producing four carbon copies. The Independent office was favored with one of the copies which makes the work easier for the compositor who set the table for this issue. Last Thursday evening, after prayer meeting at the M. E. church, Pastor Oberg was invited to the altar railing by his parishioners and presented with a gold watch as a token of the esteem the donors have for him. The case is in trusted gold and perfectly plain. The movement is from the Elgin watch factory and a perfect fit for the watch. The heavy teams that stood for an hour or more on Main street last Monday belonged to the contractor who is delivering telephone poles along the line which the O. T. & T. Co. is building into Tillamook county from North Yamhill. The company tried to buy out the Hughes line, but did not offer him its cost when copper wire was cheap. Now, the old company proposes to run him out. The duty of the public is to rally to the support of the Hughes company. The County S. S. Convention executive committee has appointed a transportation committee for chartering a car to Portland next week. The committee is Elder Sickafos, from the Christian church; E. B. Rice, Evangelical church; D. M. Gault, Congregational church; and John Connel, M. E. church. This committee will probably have Sunday here a meeting and be ready to report something interesting to their respective Sunday schools. On election day in Beaverton two ladies, Harrison Hughes, aged about 12 years, and Johnny Creighton, aged about 14, though small for his years, got into a dispute. The Creighton boy was not satisfied with an angry word, but got out his jack knife. He made a vicious lunge at the Harrison boy and struck him in the right breast, just below the collar bone. A gaping wound was the result, but fortunately for both boys no arteries were cut or the cavity of breast opened. Two or three stitches by Dr. Robinson closed the wound.
