The English government is installing American machines in the Portsmouth dock yards. At first it is one drilling and rivet machine and the electric causer. These proving as represented other devices will be used, one being the traveling crane.

It has been decided that Gov. Allen, of Porto Rico, will be succeeded Sept. 1, by Wm. H. Hunt, of Louisiana. Though of the South, Judge Hunt has spent many years in Montana and is quite thoroughly grounded in the ways of the wild and woolly west.

The arbitrators having in hand the fixing of a value on the Hillsboro light and water plant have been considering the matter for about three weeks.
