THE NEW LOBBY.

Last week when the National Pure Food Association was here, the hindrances to legislation came up. A gentleman who is much in and about Washington stated that the "Lobby influence" is not in evidence about the halls of congress to the extent that has been published. Especially is this true in the house of representatives. Doubtless there are agents who work with senate committees, for the senate is the branch that is generally sought to be controlled, but even then there is but a small amount of "work" done. He did not, however, wish to declare that no "influence" is employed to effect legislation. It is only carried through another channel which is the newspaper press of the country and especially the weekly newspapers. Selfish interests organize bureaus and send literature to the newspaper offices intending to give "information" that will appear as editorial matter. This goes to congressmen and senators as public opinion of constituents. And public opinion influences legislation. Newspapers get no money for this work or only a very few of them. In that respect they are chumps.

An example of the way the thing is done is seen in the flood of circulars that were sent out to create public opinion on the question of reducing the duty on sugar. The work was done through the Export Association of New York and the sugar trust were the people who found the money to pay the expense. The first circular that was used was one bearing the signature of Willets & Grey, editors of a sugar journal and reported to be experts in such matters. This circular detailed what immense sums of money the people were paying and are to pay for sugar, by reason of the Dingley duty. The circular did not tell the truth but rather lied outright. It stated that the consumer is paying 400 per cent on sugar imported, also that sum on home product which is sold for what ought to be the base price plus the duty. Now all Americans know that it is not the tariff that regulates the price of home production, but domestic competition, and supply and demand.

The circular was false in another place. A duty of 400 per cent is not collected on imported sugar unless it is refined sugar, but only 18 per cent. Among the people who do not always have the revenue laws for ready reference, no verification of the statement of the circular could be made, and its conclusions were accepted. Paragraphs from this circular were seen in papers from every part of the state and no doubt the press of other states were imposed upon. Even so careful a paper as the New York Outlook reproduced editorially the facts of the Willet & Grey circular. The Outlook has always been considered an ideal paper. It had the circular, and later it was published that money had been paid to the Outlook Company by the Export Association, presumably for extra copies and postage for distribution. But the New Lobby finds the press of the nation a cheaper and much more effectual way of influencing legislation.

An other example is the circulars opposing the Grant oleomargarine law, and another is the aid the country press was asked to render in opposing postoffice legislation where second-class mail matter is effected. The press of the country will have to exercise a care and sharply scan the "literature" which it is asked to use "without cost." The press has too often scored the Washington lobby to itself take the place of the boot-lickers.

REWARD FOR MERRILL.

I believe that I voice the sentiment of the majority of the people of Oregon when I say that she is entitled to the full \$1500, less cost for returning body. I have not heard one expression to the contrary.—W. H. Le-h in Oregonian.

The Independent has not heard what the majority cares to do in the matter of paying Mrs. Waggoner \$1500 for finding convict Merrill's body, but it does not think that every one favors such a procedure. Many people here think that Mrs. Waggoner has done nothing to earn the reward. The state law authorizes the superintendent of the penitentiary to offer a reward for the apprehension and "return" of the escaped convict. There is nothing said about "dead or alive." Mrs. Waggoner did nothing toward the

apprehension of Merrill, and "apprehension" is the very essence of the reward. The "dead or alive" is an addition not contemplated by the law and is put on by the superintendent. In this instance the criminal was a great one and the public would probably overlook the killing of Merrill had it been done in his apprehension, but dying by hands other than law officers, the superintendent does well to refuse to pay.
