Mr. Black, replying to this letter, pointed out that Mr. Chamberlain makes the damaging admission that he announced his preferential tariff scheme without having knowledge of the correspondence, which showed that Canada intended to negotiate directly with Germany and was prepared to give Germany the same preferential treatment as the mother country.
