

"Not Guilty."

Senator John H. Mitchell entered a plea of not guilty last Tuesday to two indictments charging conspiracy under section 5440. One indictment charging him with unlawfully accepting money while United States Senator. This is the "Putter case."

Entered plea of abatement to indictment charging him under section 1782 with accepting fees while a United States Senator, through the firm of Mitchell & Tanner.

Ex-Special Agent W. D. Stratford pleaded not guilty to a charge of conspiracy in connection with Battle Creek Land, Livestock & Lumber Company's indictment.

W. W. Steiwer, president; H. H. Hendricks, secretary and treasurer; Clarence B. Zachary, general manager, and C. E. Glass, bookkeeper of the Battle Creek Land, Livestock & Lumber Company, entered plea in abatement, similar to that of Senator Mitchell, the charge against them being conspiracy to "cover" or fence up the public domain.

District Attorney Heney objected to the plea in abatement on grounds of their being filed too late. Hearing will be given Friday morning at 10 o'clock.

Will Begin Within Thirty Days.
Contracts will be signed this week for construction of the road of the Oregon Traction Company from Portland to Hillsboro and Forest Grove, and the contractors will endeavor to complete the entire line in considerably less than the seven months specified as the period of construction. Most modern methods of construction will be employed, and bridge work will be under way at various points on the route while the contractors are engaged on the track work of the city portion, so that the entire track outside the city can be put down with the greatest possible speed. Sub-contracts will be let for different portions of the line.

Cars of the interurban type used generally on suburban roads in the East will be used. This type of car will be of 50 feet length, with closed body, seating a total of 56 passengers, 16 in the smoking compartment and 40 in the body of the car, and will be equipped with four 75-horsepower motors. Weight loaded will be about 25 tons, being great enough to enable fast running with safety, such as would not be possible with lighter cars.

Portland and Return 85c.

The Southern Pacific is now selling round trip tickets to Portland from Hillsboro for 85 cents, good going Saturday P. M., or any train of Sunday, returning Sunday and Monday, giving all-day Sunday and Monday in Portland. The same arrangement applies from Portland, giving all Portland people a chance to visit valley points at greatly reduced rates.

On June 1st the whipping post law goes into effect and it is said the deputy sheriffs of Multnomah county have their eyes on several men who make it a past-time to beat their wives. If convicted of the offenses, the officers will take a great deal of pleasure in administering the twenty lashes, as the law requires. Another law which should, and undoubtedly will be enforced, is that providing a fine of \$100 to \$1,000 or imprisonment in the county jail in cases where saloon-keepers in the county sell liquor to girls under 21 years of age. On May 18 the new law relating to disorderly houses goes into effect. This law not only makes it an offense to keep such a house, but extends the penalty to the owner of the property as well as the proprietor of the place. Other new laws which will go into effect May 18 are those fixing a fine of not more than \$1000 against parents who permit their children to play truant from school; a fine for jumping board bills; fine and imprisonment for hunting game out of season, and increasing the penitentiary sentences for train robbers and many others.
