TORNADO IN OKLAHOMA

WIPES OUT ENTIRE TOWN

Snyder Demolished in an Instant
led Outright--Other Towns Also Struck.

Oklahoma City, O. T., May 10--Telephone reports from Hobart, Okla., indicate that the entire town of Snyder, O. T., was destroyed by a tornado. A train of doctors, nurses and other assistants is said to have left Hobart for Snyder.

The wires are reported down between Snyder and other neighboring towns and all communication is being received from Hobart.

Oklahoma City, May 11--It is reported from Hobart via Chickasaw, that between 350 and 400 people are dead at Snyder and that the bodies are scattered over the streets and surrounding country.

The storm struck the town from the southwest, traveling north until within about 100 yards of the Oklahoma City & Western Railroad tracks. Then it took a northeasterly course through the business portion of the town. North of the track not a building is left standing. The first relief train sent from Hobart has arrived on the scene.

terrible rainstorm, a tornado from the south tore a path through the residence part of this town at midnight last night, destroying almost every house in its path and causing the death of 29 and injury to 44 persons, several of whom will die.

An unusually hot and oppressive afternoon, during which the atmosphere was loaded with electricity, was followed by a night peculiar for a deluge of rain. This continued until 11:55 p. m., when the tornado, which had formed about three miles south of town, spent its full force among the best residences, dashing them into the ruins, in which their occupants were entombed. It was gone in five minutes and continued to mark its path with devastation for many miles northward.

The roaring of the wind and the crashing of the wreckage it swept with it was followed by a moment of silence, but this was soon broken by the groans and cries of the many injured and of the terrified survivors. Then the more courageous and cool-headed began to creep forth with lanterns, and soon every able-bodied person in town was engaged in the search for the dead and rescue of the injured. Dead or mangled bodies were found pinned down among piles of lumber, which had been houses, some crushed beyond hope of their holding a spark of life, others pinned down by an arm or a leg, in which the bones were smashed and only a shred of flesh held them.

When the missing in Marquette had been pretty thoroughly accounted for, the searchers directed their attention to the surrounding country. Soon half a dozen wagonloads of dead and injured had been brought to the town from the district adjoining it on the south.

The tornado cut a clean swath 100 yards in width through the town's entire length. As it came at midnight, the people were caught without a moment's warning. Some of the victims were killed as they lay asleep; others, maimed and bleeding, awoke to find themselves buried in the wreckage of their former homes.

Nan Patterson.

"Miss Patterson" said this caller, "I have a client who stands ready to deposit \$10,000 in cash as a guarantee to fulfill a 30-week contract to put you into vaudeville in a new sketch. He will hand you \$1000 advance and start you on a salary of \$1500 a week in three weeks. I'll sign the papers now--this minute."

The girl clutched at the bars of the prison door and held on tight, as if she were afraid of falling.

"No! It's hard to believe you," said she. "You sort of stunned me at first. I am through with the stage. I've seen enough of it. A friend sent his card today. On it was written: 'I knew you when you were a baby, and I wish to see you again.'"

"Maybe that has something to do with my determination not to go on the stage--maybe not; but I was so glad some one remembered me as a baby. I was so glad that I wouldn't couldn't let that man see me as I am."

"I don't want all that money. I am not going to sign any contracts. I am

going home to my mother, and begin all over again, be a baby, for just as long as I can."

"Forty-five thousand dollars is a lot of money," suggested the lawyer for the theatrical firm.

"Not enough to buy what I want," she answered. "I want to go home and see my mother. I'm not going to sign any contracts."
