The United States census shows that all the states where women vote have grown rapidly in population, agriculture and manufactures. The following cold facts are submitted to the common sense of Oregon voters:

According to the last census, in the past ten years population increased 30 per cent. in Colorado, 32 per cent. in Utah, 49 per cent in Wyoming, and 88. per cent in Idaho. In Oregon it increased only 30 per cent.
