A Cleveland, Ohio, dispatch of May 28 says: The temperature dropped to 40 degrees here last night, a record equaled since 1871 but once. Throughout the fruit orchards along Lake Erie huge bonfires were kept burning with a view to preventing damage by frost. A dispatch from Zanesville reported a killing frost throughout the entire Muskingum Valley.

A streetcar conductor was shot and killed and his motor man shot through the hand by a midnight thug in Portland this week. A man named Stiles was held up on his own doorstep yesterday morning and relieved of \$3.50 in cash, and every paper out of that city reports one or more cases of robbery daily. There is one satisfaction, however, the police keep right on investigating.

Boys leave the farm because they don't enjoy fourteen or fifteen hours of bitter hard work every day; they don't like to get up before daylight in the morning and toll like steam engines until after dark in the evening. The best way to encourage the farmer boys is to let them have their sleep in the mornings; call ten hours a day's work; let them have their evenings for themselves, without a thousand heart-breaking charges to embitter their souls and make them old before their time.

The most disastrous fire Salem has experienced in many years occurred at noon Wednesday when the Joseph Meyers & Son's dry goods store was destroyed by flames that started from a gas flatiron heater. The damage to the stock of goods was about \$50,000. The flames, smoke and water ruined the carpets, furniture and paraphernalia in the Masonic lodges in the third floor of the building, causing a loss of \$6000. The building, owned by E. P. McCormack and known as the Reed opera house block, was damaged to the amount of \$10,000. The loss is covered by insurance.

Rev. Dr. Aked said in a Sunday sermon: "I understand that no American parent ever says to a boy or girl, as English parents do, 'Don't ask questions.' Children ought to ask questions. It is yours not to repress curiosity but to direct it." That is very well said. Two unparadiseable wrongs are done to children in this and every other country. One is to get them up in the morning before they have had their sleep and the other is to be impatient with their questions. The Perkins bill, passed at the last session of the state legislature, is important to dealers and handlers of fruit. It provides that you must mark or label your fruit according to the locality in which it is grown; that you must not receive fruit from one locality and re-pack in another and mark it as having been grown in the place where it was re-packed, thus misleading the public; that you must not receive for shipment any fruit that bears a misleading label in reference to the place of growth or re-pack; that a dealer in fruit must not receive or purchase fruit that is falsely labeled as to the place where grown or re-packed; that you must mark or label each crate or package of fruit with your name as grower and shipper together with your postoffice address; that no company or common carrier will be permitted to receive your fruit for shipment if any of these provisions are violated.

Land and Mineral Decisions.
The following synopsis of Land and Mineral Decisions is furnished this office by Woodford D. Harlan, Land Attorney, Washington, D. C., and under this head will be published from week to week decisions which may be of interest to our readers:

The characterizing of land as coal must be determined by the actual production from mining on the tract, or by satisfactory evidence that coal exists thereon in sufficient quantity to make it more valuable for mining than for agriculture.

The allowance of an application to contest a final entry is a matter resting in the sound discretion of the commissioner of the land office.

Local officers have no authority to order a hearing on a final entry.

Second homestead entries may be allowed by Act of April 29, 1904 (33 Stat., 527), to persons who have made, and also abandoned, former entries prior to said Act.

The 5-year-old child of Captain Young of Willamette, a suburb of Oregon City, has the first case of cerebra spinal meningitis of the malignant type that has appeared in that city. Dr. E. J. Wheeler, city health officer of Portland, went to Oregon City and after making an examination agreed with the diagnosis of Dr. Ernest A. Sommer. The case is contagious and fear is expressed of the spread of the disease.

"The people of this country," says W. S. Stratton, head of the United States bureau of weights and measures, during an address before the university students at Salem last Tuesday night, "would rather buy a pound of 15 ounces of any commodity, than one of 16 ounces. The United States has sent accurate scales, which cannot be tampered with, all over the United States, but now they are rusting in the basements of the places to which consigned. Only one state, Massachusetts, enforces her laws, compelling the merchants not to cheat in weight." Thus Mr. Stratton characterized the results of the efforts of Uncle Sam to protect the households of the country.

Three steel bridges, each 150 feet long, will be turned out by the American Bridge Company for the Pacific Railway & Navigation Company's Hillsboro Tillamook line. The parts are to be assembled by Robert Wakefield, and delivery is expected to be made by August 1. The structures are intended to cross the Miami, Killebas and Wilson rivers, and will cost about \$60,000. Another contract to be awarded soon is for the construction of ten additional miles of main line from Milpote 20, northeast of Tillamook, on the Salmonberry line. On the ten-mile stretch is considerable heavy earthwork, some trestling and a tunnel, the latter having already been constructed. The Astoria branch, covering 60 miles of line, has been located, and the maps have been adopted by directors of the company.—Portland Telegram.

Those persons who clasp their hands with two fingers between the thumb and finger instead of the usual one are probably very deceitful. To lay the left hand flat in the lap and clasp the right firmly over it is a sign of obstinacy. Business capacity is shown if the left fingers are curved inward. To clasp the hands together very tightly, running the fingers down as far as they will go, shows, it is said, that the character is sincere, but if the left thumb be uppermost, and the right little finger concealed in the left palm, a secretive nature, though not one necessarily untruthful, is denoted. Thoughtfulness and consideration for the feelings of others are shown if when the elbows are placed on a desk or table the thumb and first fingers are clasped tightly. A keen intellect and great self-confidence are possessed by the man who interlaces his fingers and then places his hands palm downward, flatly on his knee. To clasp the hands in the ordinary way, with the right thumb uppermost, shows that one is born to rule. If the left thumb comes uppermost, the owner is born to be ruled, says Woman's Life. When the hands are allowed to lie loosely on the knee, with each set of fingers joined and barely touching the other, it shows weakness of character and indecision.
