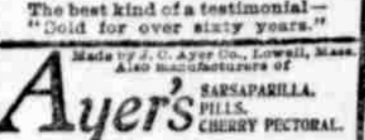

## JAPAN STUDIES ICE MAKING.

Mikado's Government to Adopt American Cold Storage Methods.  
T. Uchiyama, of Tokyo, accompanied by T. Kawamura, also of Tokyo, and I. Kuzuhara, a recent Japanese resident of New York, arrived in this city Sunday and registered at the Bellevue Stratford. They are on a business mission of vast importance to Japan, says the Philadelphia Inquirer.

This mission is a study of American methods of artificial ice making and cold storage. Mr. Uchiyama has been for ten years counselor of the department of commerce and agriculture of Japan, and was also recently appointed adviser to the civil administration of Saghalien Island, ceded by Russia to Japan at the close of the late Russo-Japanese war. He has been in this country only about four weeks.  
T. Kawamura, who, unlike his chief, speaks English fluently, said: "Japan has no ice making and cold storage plants. We realize that they are a necessity with us, since we have not enough room to supply our 50,000,000 population with foodstuffs.

"We are making an investigation of American artificial ice manufacturing and cold storage plants and Mr. Uchiyama will make his report upon them as soon as he returns to Tokyo."  
"Japan will then install throughout the empire ice making and cold storage systems like those in this country. We also propose to establish lines of refrigerating steamships between Japan and America."  
"Thus we will be able to import from your country to ours great quantities of meats, vegetables and fruits, which we can keep on ice for our people to devour." The first thing the Japanese visitors did upon their arrival at the hotel was to inspect the Bellevue-Stratford's elaborate refrigerating plant, which evoked their intense admiration.

Upon his recovery he again implored his father to send him to school and, meeting a refusal, deliberately broke his leg the second time that he might have leisure to study. His heroic determination to learn resulted in his being placed in the same institution attended by his brother, where his natural ability and great industry gathered a thorough knowledge of the best English literature and a fair acquaintance with the Latin classics.—Ohio Magazine.

**The Fat Morgans.**

## Rapid Growth.
