Eggs Cheap Next Winter.

There are probably 1,200,000 cases of eggs in the coolers in Chicago. New York has nearly 900,000 cases, while St. Louis, Philadelphia, Boston and the other large markets of the country have proportionately more than at any time in the history of the egg-storing business. You can figure that these eggs went into the coolers in March, April and May and at from 17½¢ to 19½¢ seaboard. The latter price, of course, was paid about the last part of March, and for an exceedingly fine grade of stock. It is thought that the bulk of eggs went into the coolers at an average of about 18½¢ seaboard.

There is no reason why the consumer should not eat 250 eggs all winter. Of course, if the stock brought 30c or more, it would be so much the better for the holder from a speculative point of view.

The egg situation does not look any too good, and it is going to take considerable finesse on the part of the holders to get their money out of them. The stocks are too heavy, and there does not seem

any indication of a let-up in the production.

The people have got to eat eggs, and they have got to be shown where eggs as food are much cheaper than meat, and it lies within the power of the commission merchant who comes in frequent contact with the market reporter of the daily newspaper to keep continually before the egg-eating public the fact that this edible is going to continue at a low price throughout the winter because of the heavy supplies on hand.—New York Packer.
