Land and Mineral Decisions. The following decisions are furnished The Independent by Woodford D. Harlan, Land Attorney, Washington, D. C.:

Coal Land—As between two claimants, both claiming the land on account of the coal therein, priority of application and good faith in improvements should govern the award.

Contest—Withdrawal of contest will not prevent the government from taking advantage of the evidence submitted.

Submerged Land—There is no law authorizing the entry of submerged land lying within a navigable stream.

Homestead—The qualifications requisite to make homestead entry must exist at date of entry, and rights acquired by filing an application are lost where the applicant subsequently and prior to entry becomes disqualified to enter.

Mineral or Non-mineral—The presumption as to the mineral or agricultural character of a tract, created by the return of the surveyor-general, does not preclude the assertion of any right, or the proof of the facts in the case as they really exist.

Practice—Practice before the local land office not affected by state procedure.

Hypothetical questions will not be considered by the land department.

Residence—Residence is established from the moment a settler goes upon the land with the definite intention of making his home there.

Immediately after the congratulations of their relatives and friends all repaired to the dining room where the wedding luncheon was served to thirty guests.

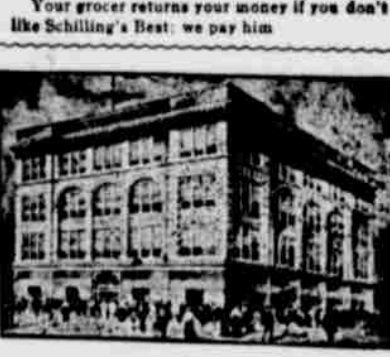
They were the recipients of many beautiful presents. The happy couple left on the five o'clock train for Portland for a short trip and will be at home to their friends at Carlton after December 1st.
