A base ball park, dancing pavilion, beer garden, etc., is said to be under construction on the old brick yard grounds lying without the corporate limits on the east of town.

A photograph gallery conducted by young Mr. Roelich, a new arrival, and brother of the saddle, has been opened to the public of late and bids fair to become a successful business.

Eli Calkins, of Hoodview, who has been under treatment for several months for alcoholic dementia at the state asylum, is reported to have fully recovered his mental equilibrium and will ask for a discharge soon.

Pearl White, an employee of Frank Lukes, the barber, will soon open a barber shop in our neighboring town of Tualatin. That little burg seems to be drawing attention in their direction since the completion of the electric car line to Salem.

The Southern Pacific management have withdrawn the usual Saturday reduced rates of 75 cents for round trip to the city. One pays straight 55 cents each way. With the aid of cheap Japs as section men, in addition, the road should manage to pay taxes and running expenses at least.

Prof. Chas. Hanson, formerly principal of Sherwood school, was in town Saturday on his way to the city. Prof. Hanson has charge of a school in the Wonderleigh neighborhood about three or four miles west of this place on the mountain range.

M. E. Buck, justice of the peace and registration officer for this precinct, reports voters very delinquent in the matter of complying with the law, or duty regarding the right of franchise. But a small proportion of the legal voters have found time so far to call upon him and register.

Some individual unknown here, having an animosity toward the dog fraternity, has been quietly gratifying the same by dealing out poison of some nature. Several deaths have occurred among the cur family during the week and the owners thereof are highly indignant at the result.

Fred Epler, cashier of the Bank of Sherwood, reports deposits in that institution, since the commencement of business to the present time, of upwards of \$40,000. While the bank is yet a "fledgling" in financial affairs, the ultimate outcome indicate prosperity and success.

Sherwood pupils attending college at Newberg report an epidemic of mumps prevailing in that vicinity. Many scholars are absent on sick leave, however, the school faculty have not yet considered it necessary to discontinue the daily routine of class work.

From Beaverton.

Rev. E. F. Zimmerman, secretary of the Anti-Saloon League of Oregon, gave a very interesting talk and illustrated lecture to a crowded house at the hall last Friday evening.

The surveyors for the Hillsboro branch of the Oregon Electric line have been working near this place for several days. It is understood that they are endeavoring to locate a route for the line through town passing near the Catholic church instead of building about one-half mile north as the survey made last fall called for.

The funeral services over the remains of the late C. L. Mittel, who died on the 13th inst. at the family home in this place, were held Sunday morning at the M. E. church. Interment was at Raleigh cemetery. The deceased was 64 years old and was survived by a wife and six children.

The Beaverton Horticultural Society met in the Grange Hall last Saturday. A small but enthusiastic number of orchardists were present and Beaverton may yet become noted for apple raising as well as onions.

The lumber for the new sidewalk from Mrs. Summers' corner to the R. R. track, funds for which were raised by popular subscription, has all been delivered and the laying of it began last Monday.

From Mr. Yates.

Editor Independent—So you think my correspondence a "little strong," and you read more papers very likely than I do. For myself, I believe I have only voiced the expressions of others in editorial and reporters; even our much esteemed president has expressed himself as to the fraudulent actions of wealth and combines. Such persons can say just what they please, but when a poor man expresses his thought he is more likely suspected of being an anarchist—not a socialist. That is what newspapers are for and patronized to voice the opinions of those that go to make up this great country. They are helping to keep up the government and are supposed, according to our constitution, to have a voice in its administration. What about banks? Why even at our own doors we are experiencing just what I remarked. How about the timber and land frauds? How about the railroads? How about crime? How about world buying the titles of the old world? Can't you see that human nature leans to ward monarchy that way, and agrarianism points blank against the constitution of the United States; and as an alien, come to cast my lot with the New World, I had to forewear my own allegiance to my own country.

The very country that we try to copy in its laws—and yet the native born and educated Americans pander to the very things that we are supposed to have given up for the cause of liberty and the pursuit of happiness. Pshaw! Why the foreigners when once located here are more loyal to the country of their adoption than are the full-blood of their own.

Can we then not speak our thoughts as to their adopted country of which we expect so much? For forty years I have claimed this as my own, and as my own I claim a right to the freedom of the press to condemn the actions of those placed in power to administer to the welfare of the nation. For thirty years or more I have cast my vote with the present administration because I believe in their ability to make this country prosperous. They have, but they have allowed "too" much "liberty" to wealth, until it is money that rules, not honesty and patriotism; and I shall continue to condemn when I can. We are not the same people as of 40 years ago.

Then the aim was to place the nation on its feet again. Now, what is being done? We have pursued in prosperity, which if continued will bring adversity and woe, and the only remedy, peaceful reform is going on and it must go on for the welfare of our nation. It cannot be stopped. What we want in this country is less law and more justice. As it is now, the aims of justice are defeated by what is called the brilliancy of the law.

The less law the more perfect justice being dealt out by honesty and purity. That is the base for a nation to stand on, and it will never totter on its foundation. I presume some one will say most of those people out of employment are tramps and people that don't care for work if they can get along without it. Let me say that in New Zealand, a country of about 900,000 people, about the size of Kansas, has no such people as tramps, because they have the most perfect government known to the world—(co-operative). Money does rule there. Because the people do. There are no land frauds operating there. The government controls the railroads. New Zealand builds her own railroads and has 22,000 miles, costing \$0 millions and says taxation is mostly singletax and they have a progressive income tax. The poor are taken care of and so is old age by pensions. They have postal savings banks. Counting that as a state, what one state can do, others can do as well. That government runs the telephones, telegraphs, rating 500 per cent less than our Western Union, and pays a profit. Such is the government we should aspire to have and prosper.
