Ship Timber 8,000 Miles.

An Australian corporation has just received a concession from the Russian government to take out 30,000,000 feet of timber a year from a forest in Siberia, 900 miles from Vladivostok, to be delivered in Melbourne, Australia, approximately 8,000 miles away, and nearly three times the distance from New York to San Francisco.

It is likely that no lumbering operation of recent years more strongly illustrates the pinch in the timber supply in all parts of the world. In the news of the concession, told in an American lumber journal, is the suggestion of the difficulty that all countries may have to encounter in getting the wood which they need in the future. Every year timber cruisers are going further and further afield and cutting trees which in former times of abundance they passed because of the inaccessibility of the forest.

In taking out the Siberian timber the Melbourne lumbermen will have to ship the entire year's cut in July, August, September and October, for during the remainder of the year there is no open water at the point of shipment. What makes this unusual feature of transporting bulky logs 8,000 miles quite feasible is that such manufactured stock is admitted free, while there is a heavy duty on all manufactured wood brought into Australia, the duty on lumber, for instance, being nearly \$5 a thousand board feet. At Melbourne a new mill is being erected to manufacture these logs into dressed stock.

Forest experts in this country say that the hope of the United States for a steady supply of timber lies in the application of forestry to all timber lands, private and public, and the careful study of the economical and better utilization of product. Even so, a severe shortage in twenty to twenty-five years must be expected.

Under the head of "A Sorry Fabrication," the Portland Oregonian says:

Mr. Lincoln Steffens, the magazine writer, has written an article for the American Magazine for March, on politics in Oregon, of which advance sheets have been received. In his effort to describe conditions in Oregon during the past years the writer says:

Scott, the really great editor of that really great newspaper, The Oregonian (and of its afternoon edition, the Telegram), one night in 1903. There was a contest on for United States senator. Ladd, the leading banker of Portland, wired it (hence the verbal errors) to Salem. Here it is.

"In case I receive Jonathan Bourne, Jr.'s support for United States senator at the joint session of the legislature tonight, I hereby agree to use the full power of the Morning Oregonian and the Evening Telegram to defeat John H. Mitchell at the next senatorial election, and elect Jonathan Bourne, Jr., in his place.

"I further agree that if I receive the support of Jonathan Bourne, Jr., for United States senator in the joint session tonight that I elected I will turn all the federal patronage over to Jonathan Bourne, Jr.

"I hereby further agree in lieu (view) of receiving the support of Jonathan Bourne tonight at the

joint session of the legislature that whether elected or not I will pay to Jonathan Bourne \$25,000 in United States gold coin."

It is simply fiction. This so-called agreement, alleged to have been written by Mr. Scott, was not written by him nor dictated by him, nor even seen by him, till now. It never existed. It is a fabrication by somebody, and sheer forgery. It follows, of course, that it was not 'wired' to Salem, on the last night of the session, or at any time; by Mr. Ladd, or by any other; and Mr. Ladd, moreover, never saw it till it was shown him in this magazine article.

PROPOSALS WANTED.

For Crushing and Hauling Rock.

Sealed bids will be received by the County Court of Washington County, Oregon, until 2:00 P. M. of the 14th day of March, 1908, and then opened for the crushing of 5500 cubic yards of rock, 2000 yards at the Thatcher quarry four miles north of Forest Grove, 2000 yards at the Spring Hill quarry four miles south of Forest Grove and 1500 yards at the Cedar Mill quarry three miles north of Beaverton on the Cornell road.

The County will furnish the crusher now at the Thatcher quarry. The contractor will be required to move and set up the machinery at the different quarries.

Bidders will be required to name a price per Cubic yard delivered in the bins, the two finer grades to comprise at least 45 per cent of the product, also a price for the excess needed over the 45 per cent of the two finer grades.

Bids will also be received at the same time for the hauling of said rock, bids to state the price per cubic yard, per mile.

Bids may be made on the crushing alone or on the crushing and hauling together or on any part of the hauling.

The County reserves the right to increase the above amounts of rock to be crushed 50 per cent at each of the quarries, also the right to reject any or all bids.

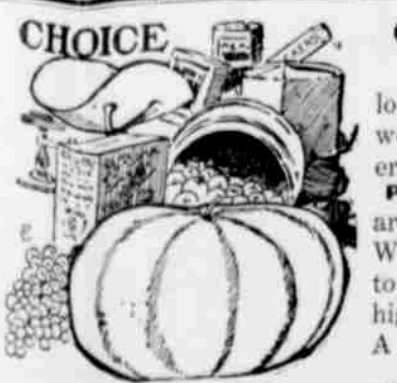

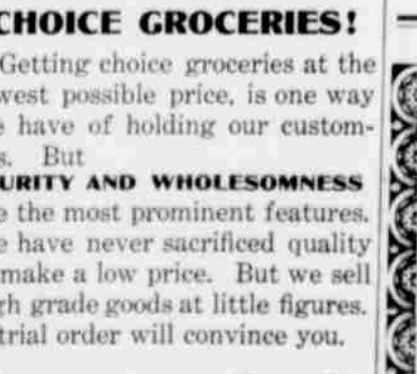
