## Hillsboro Independent.

**D. W. BAYH Editor and Proprietor.**

Hon. W. N. Barrett this week filed his petition for the nomination of joint senator.

On Wednesday E. W. Haines of Forest Grove filed a suit in the circuit court against Frank T. Kane, et al, charging him with the misappropriation of funds approximating \$25,000, and manipulation of books of the plaintiff's bank. Mr. Kane denies the charges and says he will fight the case to a finish.

R. H. Greer has filed notice that he is out for the nomination of representative and has chosen for his declaration that if elected he will "work for the interest of the people of the county, will oppose all extravagant legislation and will support the republican choice for United States senator." He desires printed after his name on the ballot the words: "Will favor an economical administration of public affairs." If nominated and elected, Mr. Greer can be relied on as doing as he has promised. He started in as a poor boy and by strict attention to business has established a good trade and considerable property. He has been four times elected as school director and has filled all offices of trust satisfactorily.

Hon. H. M. Cake delivered an able address at the court house last Wednesday evening and for an hour held the attention of those present closely. He gave in a clean-cut manner his reasons for standing by Statement No. 1, and said that he believed a large majority of the people are with him. He declared that he believes that a United States senator should be elected by the people and not by the legislature, as has been the custom. That he is willing to stand by their choice, and if elected he will serve them faithfully and to the best of his ability. We believed in Mr. Cake when he was before the people two years ago, at which time Washington county rolled him up a splendid majority, and we believe in him now, and we think the result at the primary election in April in this county will be favorable to his nomination. He is a man fully able to assume the duties of United States senator, and if sent to Washington he promises to do all in his power to advance the best interests of Oregon and the people he will represent.

Two weeks ago The Independent said a good word for a good official and our worthy friend W. D. Smith falls into a fit, gets the aid of one of our city attorneys, and together they produce a letter perfectly devoid of good horse sense, and had it published in the Argus last week, making the communication a personal attack on us. Just why Mr. Smith is grieved, he does not say, or what business it is of his that this paper should speak in good terms of an efficient official, is something he does not explain.

He admits every statement made in the article referred to until he reaches that part where a woman deputy is mentioned, then he gets white in the face, has an awful cramp, and rushes into print. He says that Mr. Goodin was the best county clerk Washington county ever knew, but failed to mention that Mr. Goodin married the lady who had been his assistant in the office for more than a year.

He also refers to J. A. Imbrie, and intimates that he was just a trifle better than Mr. Goodin, but here again he fails to mention that both Mr. Imbrie's wife and daughter assisted him in the office, and we will venture the assertion that the work performed by all the ladies mentioned was perfectly satisfactory. At least they have escaped the criticism that has been handed out in large chunks to some others.

After consigning the women to outer darkness and forbidding them the privilege of earning an honest living in any county office, he goes after the third-termers.

He believes no man is entitled to a third term, but has not a word to say about Treasurer Jackson, who is a third term, and the people seem to want him again. Neither does he mention Assessor Wilcox, who has grown gray in the assessor's office. Still we must admit that there is a growing opinion going over the county that he is overdoing the "third-term" act and should make room for a newer man. Twelve or fourteen years in one office ought to satisfy any man, but if the voters of Washington county want him, or any other man, it is their privilege to vote him in. So, Friend Smith, keep right on running, and if you are wanted the voters will tell you all about it, and if elected, they will only demand that you conduct their affairs intelligently and as good as your predecessor. And you have our permission to choose whoever you wish as a deputy—a woman if you wish.
