Josephine county has an exhibit which will probably be popularly voted the most artistic in the entire building. The roof of the booth is hung with big clusters of Tokay grapes and in the body of the booth is massed a wonderfully lovely collection of the same fruit.

Grants Pass grapes are furnishing much of the decoration for the southern Oregon booth, as well as the Oregon exhibit in the Palace of Horticulture. H. O. Frobach, southern Oregon's representative in the Oregon building, has compassed his booth with grapevines laden with monster bunches of the Grants Pass grapes, and the effect is very lovely.

NEW MAP OF THE SISKIYOU RESERVE.

The forestry service has just published a map of the Siskiyou reserve for the special use of tourists and campers. The map is a large and comprehensive one, showing all the trails and roads into and through the reserve, with every camping place, location of water, etc., marked.
