

More than a year ago the Public Service corporation, through Manager Sanders, was granted a franchise for the construction of an electric lighting system within grounds if desired. the city. A bond of \$1,000 was entered into for the performance of the terms of the franchise, which provided that two miles of wire should be erected within the city and carrying current within nine months. The time limit expired last spring, and work upon the system within the city seif. had not been commenced. The bond
