Schall is an "unreconstructed rebel," as the dyed-in-thewool, refuse-to-die progressives call themselves. He can be counted on to favor only the party that puts up what he thinks is the most progressive legislation and the best man for speaker. Fuller is said to have grown his independent faith from the political emanations of former democratic Governor Foss of Massachusetts, who has frequently hopped back and forth from republican to democratic affiliation.

There will be several new faces in the senate. Prominent among the freshmen is Hiram Johnson, progressive extraordinary and ples ary from the state that seems to have been the deciding wedge in the presidential balance California.

Another is J. O. Wolcott, of Delaware. Wolcott won from DuPont, one of the yenerable elder senators, Frank B. Kellog, "trust buster,"

has been ordered by Minnesota to take up the job Senator Clapp will eave off on March 4.

Some of the best known faces will be missing. Senator Clarke of Wyoming, who ranked along with Senator Lodge and Veteran Gallinger in length of service, was defeated. Eskime Lamps.
It is believed that the Eskimo lamp was invented before its possessors emigrated from their original home which was probably farther south and near the seaconst. But the form of the smp becomes more specialized the higher the latitude is. The lamps of southern Alaska have a wick edge of two inches, while those of Point Bar-row and northern Greenland have wick edges of seventeen to thirty six inches. The lamp is employed for melting snow and ice to obtain drinking water, for cooking, lighting, warming, drying skins and in the arts. It is also a social factor and the sign of the family unit, each head of the family having his lamp.
