I'LL PAY MY BILLS SO YOU CAN PAY YOURS CITIZENS TO MAKE LIBERTY SPEECHES

"I'll pay my bills so you can pay yours," is a slogan which will be used throughout the country during the next two weeks. It is the slogan of the National Pay-Up week campaign, a campaign which originated in Des Moines, Iowa, and which has helped to make Des Moines famous. It has proved of great value in many parts of the United States, and the organization of Beavers of this city has decided that a campaign of this kind would be of great benefit to this city.

There are on the books of the 18 members of the Beavers more than \$50,000 of accounts that are considered good. This means that 18 business men of this city are loaning to the citizens of Grants Pass \$50,000 without interest. It means that these merchants are paying interest on large amounts that they should not be obliged to pay, and it also means that these business men are sufferers because they have accommodated their patrons to this amount.

During the week of October 29, a five dollar bill could be made to pay hundreds of dollars in debts before the week closes, for it would be passed from one to another, closing up an account here, reducing an account there, and bringing relief from financial stress with every move. It is probable that at least one-half of the \$50,000 owing these 18 merchants could be paid without inconvenience to the parties owing, as much of the indebtedness is simply the result of carelessness, could be paid at any time but is simply overlooked. It is the mission of Pay-Up week to set a date for the national liquidation of debts.

A Family of Bees.

KAMOUFLAGED KISSEL KAR PASSES THROUGH

The famous camouflaged Kissel Kar passed through this city Friday en route south. This Kissel Kar is the one which made the record run for the coast defense league, and is the first car on the Pacific coast to be camouflaged. Camouflage, a French word, means in military language, to paint a thing so that it resembles its surrounding so closely, that it cannot be discerned easily by the enemy. Big guns are painted brown on top to make them look like the earth where they sit, and if there is any green foliage near, spots of green are painted upon the guns to resemble it. Waves are painted upon ships, the air craft is painted to resemble the clouds, underneath, and to resemble the earth on top, so that from the ground, they look like the sky and from the sky they look like the earth. Motor trucks and cars are painted to resemble the landscape, as was the Kissel hundred point six touring car which passed through this city Friday.
