sential to the human system." Dr Hateman declared. "These foods are proteins, fats\_and carbo-hydrates, such as starch and sugar. Fats, including vegetable oils, are getting extremely scarce in Germany."

BUILD AERDROME BY CHANGING RIVER BED

London, Nov. 15 .- The opening this week of a large new aerodrome at Hanworth Park, near London, marks the completion of an engineering work which involved the acflection underground for a distance of nearly a mile, of the Wolsey river. The stream intersected the field selected for the main landing ground of the aerodrome and imfielded the landing of aircraft there. To remove this defect, the engineers constructed a conduit, capable of carrying 27,000,000 gallons of water daily, into which the stream has low been diverted, and its bed levelled to give an unbroken flat surface for the aerodrome. The size of the conduit was such that before the river was diverted 50 soldiers


