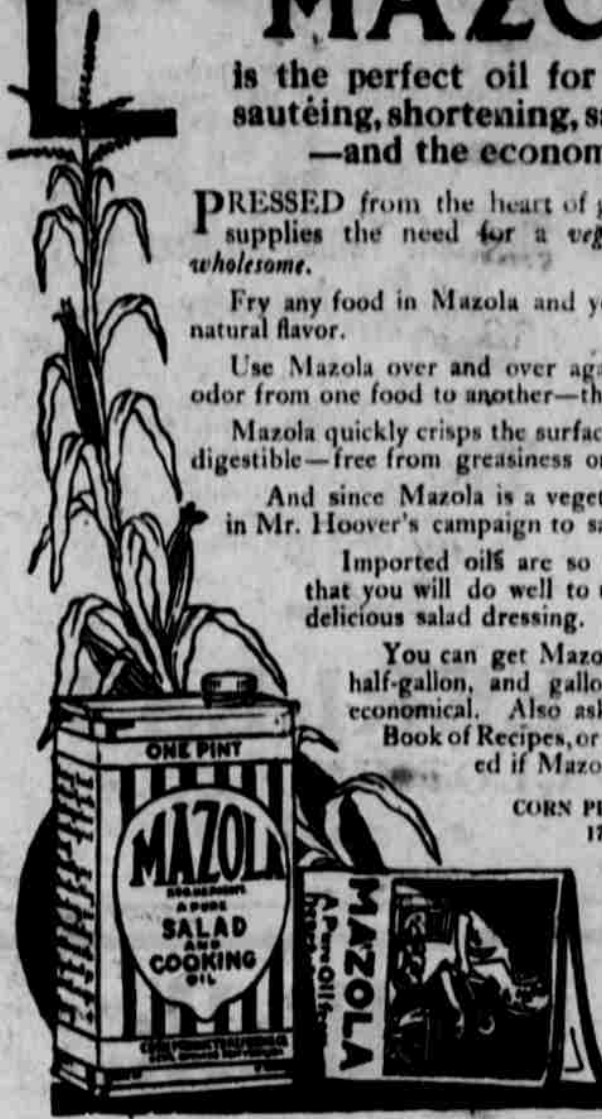

Astoria—Cranberry crop marketed from here now reached 5,000 barrels.

Nyssa—Apple crop sold for cash at good price this year.

Portland—Government officials arranging for speeding up spruce timber manufacture for airplanes in Oregon and Washington.

North Bend to get a big plant to manufacture wooden box cars.

Marshfield assured of construction of an armory at early date.

Columbia Engineering works gets new contracts for wooden ships.

Bend—Trainloads of sheep are going to eastern markets.

Marshfield—C. A. Smith mills put nine-hour day into effect November 15.

Hood River vinegar factory commandeered on government contract for the next 30 days.

Reedsport—Umpqua Courier moved from Gardiner.

Roseburg—Carnegie library planned here.

Portland—An army aviation camp and training corps is to be established at the barracks at Vancouver.

Portland—Plans for operation of Southern Pacific trains over the Siskiyou mountains by electricity are again forming.

Coquille working for \$30,000 bridge over Coquille river.

ARMY NEEDS MORE SKILLED MECHANICS

The quartermaster corps of the army needs as many skilled technical workers in the mechanical trades and industries as it is possible to obtain by voluntary enlistment.

Practically all the trades are enumerated in the circular received by him which also states that all accepted applicants are to be enlisted as privates.

After the men have been accepted they will be sent to the nearest recruiting depot for enlistment, after which they will go to the quartermaster mobilization and training camp at Camp Joseph E. Johnson, Jacksonville, Fla., for training and formation into units for field service.
