UNDUE OPTIMISM

Dr. George W. Crile, the famous Cleveland surgeon, returning to this country after five months of hospital work in France, says that he is surprised at the optimism he finds. "It is only after my arrival at New York," he says, "that I find talk of an early end of the war. I hear no one over there express the opinion that the enemy was weakening or that the Germans were starving. I talked with many German prisoners. They seemed to have been well fed and well taken care of.

"Germany is conducting a widespread peace offensive against the people of the United States. She is conducting it in this country. And from the expressions I hear on every hand at home, it looks as though she was being successful to a decided degree. Have you noticed that the very day, or the next day following newspaper reports of mutinies or riots in Germany, a first class Teutonic offensive starts which gains more ground in a week, than the allies have gained in months?"

While there may be dissatisfaction among Germans, that nation is no where near civil disintegration. Germans are probably hearing of I. W. W. riots, and bomb plots, and factory explosions and dock fires, and the like which are almost daily occurring in America. But what American would seriously question the national determination to fight this war to a successful finish?

We know that the Russian collapse has released large Teutonic armies along that front for action elsewhere. We surmise that this is the real explanation of German successes in the Italian offensive,—coupled with the usual German strategy of striking a fierce blow against the weakest link in the allied chain, in the hope that she can start a move for peace while she is in a position, territorially, to make concessions and still win a substantial victory for kaiserism. But we certainly do not know that Germany is so weak that she cannot keep up the fight for years to come, and it is the part of foolishness for this government to proceed on any other assumption.

Word from Washington indicates that those in authority there are of this opinion. War preparations have been started on a vast scale. They are constantly being broadened. There is talk of an army of 5,000,000 men. While every American hopes that it will not be necessary to throw such an army into the scales on the side of justice and democracy, still the country as a whole realizes that it will be infinitely better to train too many men than too few; to build more ships than are absolutely needed, and to

PHYSICAL RULES FOR RECRUITS CHANGED
Portland, Nov. 20.—The local army recruiting station has announced a reform in the orders concerning physical unfitness of applicants.

Heretofore a man physically unfit for one branch was declared unfit for any branch. By the new ruling the secretary of war has declared that in the case of expert mechanics, physical imperfections may be waived. The repair shop units and quartermaster corps of the national army are now prepared to take men who before had to be turned down. It is expected that this will stimulate enlistments of volunteers. The recruiting station announced an average of 40 men a day sent to camps from the Portland district, which includes Oregon and southwestern Washington.

ALLIED WAR COUNCIL IN SESSION AT LONDON
London, Nov. 20.—The allied war council is in session here. Colonel House did not attend but General Bliss is here.

EXPLOSION IN NAVAL FACTORY KILLS ONE
Washington, Nov. 21.—One unidentified man was killed and a large quantity of explosives was destroyed last night in an explosion at the naval powder factory at Indian Head, Md. It was announced by the navy department this afternoon. The origin of the explosion is being investigated.
