BATTLE PLANES ON WAY TO FRANCE

Washington, Feb. 21.—The first American-built battle planes are en route to completion, nearly five months ahead of schedule. In making this announcement tonight, Secretary Baker said the first shipment, although in itself not large, "marks the final overcome of many difficulties met in building up this new and intricate industry."

"These planes," Mr. Baker said, "are equipped with the first Liberty motors from machine production. One of them in a recent test surpassed all records for speed and climbing for planes of that type. Engine production, which began a month ago, is now on a quantity basis, and the peak soon should be reached."

"Only 12-cylinder type is being made, as developments abroad have made it wise to concentrate on the high-powered engine instead of the eight cylinder."

Optimistic as these statements appear, they said they should not be exaggerated, and should be considered in the light of these facts:

That after three years of warfare the total number of planes able to take the air at any one time on either side of the western front has not been more than 2,500, that 46 men are required on the ground for every plane in the air, making a total of 115,000 men needed for the present maximum of 2,500 planes—that for every plane in the air there must be two replacement planes on the ground, and one training plane for every pilot who eventually reaches the front, with a spare on the ground for each plane.

AMBULANCE WORK IS HONORED BY FRANCE

Paris, Feb. 21.—The American ambulance, its founders and its work again have been signally honored by the French government. The under-secretary of the department of public health has notified Laurence V. Benet of Washington, one of the organizers of the American ambulance and chairman of the ambulance committee since the death of Captain Frank A. Mason, that he has been promoted from officer in command to the Legion of Honor.

Eugene LaChaise, of New York, a volunteer at the organization of the American ambulance, now second in command of the American sections, has been promoted from chevalier to officer of the Legion of Honor.

Dr. Charles W. U. Bochet, of Philadelphia, one of the founders of the ambulance and surgeon in chief from its inception until the taking over of the institution by the army, has been created a chevalier of the legion.

GERMANS MAY NOT BE READY FOR DRIVE

London, Feb. 21.—Major-General Frederick B. Maurice, chief director of military operations at the British war office, said today there had been no developments on the west front during the past fortnight to indicate that the German offensive was near. One of the most satisfactory features of the work in the past two weeks has been British successes in the air, which has great importance as the preliminary to any battle.

General Maurice added that the British air predominance hampered the enemy greatly in gaining information which was required by him before any important battle.

Discussing the efforts of the Germans to have the Geneva convention arrange for a discontinuance of the use of poisonous gas, General Maurice said the entente would be glad to give up this gas if it were possible to get any guarantee that Germany would be bound by a promise to do likewise.
