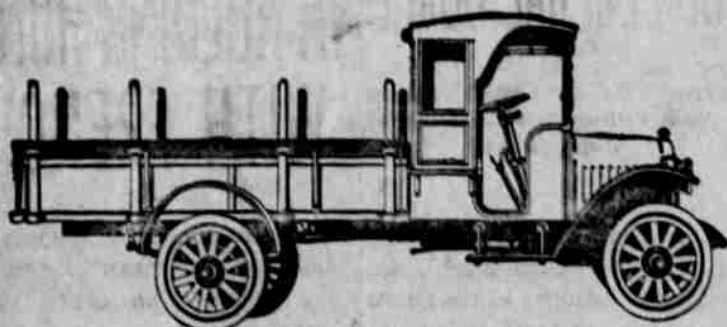

ALASKA COAL TO BE SHIPPED

Anchorage, Alaska, Jan. 29.—(By mail)—Coal from mines being operated by the United States government in Alaska probably will be shipped to north Pacific coast points in quantity during the coming summer.

Through the Alaska engineer commission, the government is working two mines, one at Esk Creek and the other at Chickaloon, both on the

railroad being built from Seward to Fairbanks.

According to Sumner Smith, superintendent of the government mines, 3,400 tons were shipped over the government railroad to Anchorage last February. When spring comes the output will be increased, Mr. Smith asserts. Last year, according to the department of the interior, 50,000 tons of high grade coal was shipped to the outside.

KNITTING DEPARTMENT R. C. INSTRUCTIONS

The local Red Cross chapter is in receipt of a letter from Mrs. John H. Powell, superintendent of the miscellaneous department of the Red Cross. She says: "We are in receipt of reports from the knitting inspector at the Red Cross bureau of supplies in regard to the knitting sent in from Josephine county chapter."

The sweaters were uniformly excellent, as were also the wristlets. The socks were all right in every respect but the toes. So long as your knitters make so many and so well, it is very desirable that a special effort be made to see that all learn the Kitchner toe. In every other way you would be candidates for our honor roll which would mean that your boxes would not be inspected."

The committee in charge of the knitting would like to say that a number of ladies are making the Kitchner toe and as that is the only part of our work that is defective we feel we will have the entire cooperation of the knitters in correcting this and will place our chapter on the honor roll.

Through the kindness of the Courier in this issue you will find the directions for finishing the Kitchner toe. Please keep it for future help.

KNITTING DEPARTMENT.

To Finish Kitchner Toe

The stitches are now all on two needles opposite each other. Hold work so that the end of yarn is at the right hand side of back needle and push loops well towards needle tips. Break yarn, leaving a 12-inch end, which should be threaded into a blunt needle or bodkin.

When working as in plain knitting the bodkin should point to the right and in purling to the left. The finishing yarn must always be kept below the knitting needles.

Pass bodkin through first stitch on front needle as if to purl, and through first stitch of back needle as if to knit. Do not slip off. These are the preparing stitches.

Pass bodkin through front stitch of front needle as if to knit and slip stitch off.

Pass through second stitch on front needle as if to purl. Do not slip off.

Pass through first stitch of back needle as if to purl and slip stitch off.

Pass through second stitch of back needle as if to knit. Do not slip off.

Repeat process from point where bodkin is passed through first stitch of front needle as if to knit and slip off until all the stitches are off needles. Fasten thread by darning about an inch up and down, never across.

LAVA SHAFT TO BE ERECTED FOR HAWAIIANS IN WAR

Honolulu, T. H., Mar. 30.—(By mail)—The Daughters of Warriors society, a local organization made up of women whose ancestors were Hawaiian chiefs, is planning to erect a shaft of Hawaiian lava stone as a monument to the boys from this territory who have given and will give their lives in the fight against Germany. The lava shaft will be polished and on it will be engraved the names of all those who thus die in the service of their country.

LARGE SWORD FISH CAUGHT

Honolulu, T. H., Mar. 30.—(By mail)—A huge sword fish, 13 feet and eight inches long and weighing 910 pounds was brought into the local market by a Japanese fisherman recently. The fish is one of the largest ever seen here. It was sold at 30 cents a pound as fast as several men could cut it up.

Ancient Silver Coin.

A coin which is regarded as the most ancient in the world was recently discovered by an archaeologist during his explorations in North Syria. It is a coin of pure silver, bearing a perfect Aramean inscription of Panammu Bar Rerub, king of Sammol, who reigned 800 years B. C. Up to the time this coin was unearthed the Lydians had always been regarded as the inventors of money, but this find showed that the Semitic Arameans, who lived two centuries before the Lydians, are the oldest known makers of money.
