

'GERMANY IS DEFEATED' SAYS CAPTURED OFFICER

With the British Armies in France, Sept. 27.—Germany is reported to have prepared a new mechanical obstruction to supplement her waning morale and man power.

According to escaped Britishers and German prisoners, at certain places in this zone "tank forts" have been built. They are designed to meet the ever-increasing menace of the allied war chariots. They constitute well embanked and well placed gun positions.

Their armament includes field guns, trench mortars, tank rifles and machine guns, designed to operate together.

But it will take something better than "tank forts" to save this line, if a German under-officer captured a few days ago tells the truth.

"The last blow has opened the eyes of the commonest soldier to the break-up of German military supremacy," he said.

"We are defeated and know it. I doubt, however, whether the German soldiers yet uncaptured realize how crushing this defeat is. Coming through the lines I saw things I could scarcely believe. Such transport, such horses, such men! Those masses of artillery compared with our wretched iron-wheeled transport, skidding all over the place and blocking the roads in wet weather; our scanty, badly fed horses; boys pretending to be guards (he was a member of the second guards)—all emphasize the terrible contrast in the condition of the opposing armies.

"We still have a certain amount of artillery, but you must have five guns to our one. We are well off in regards shells, but you seem to have an endless supply.

"Germany is defeated. The sooner she recognizes the fact the better. But you will have to admit that we put up a good fight. No nation could have done more."

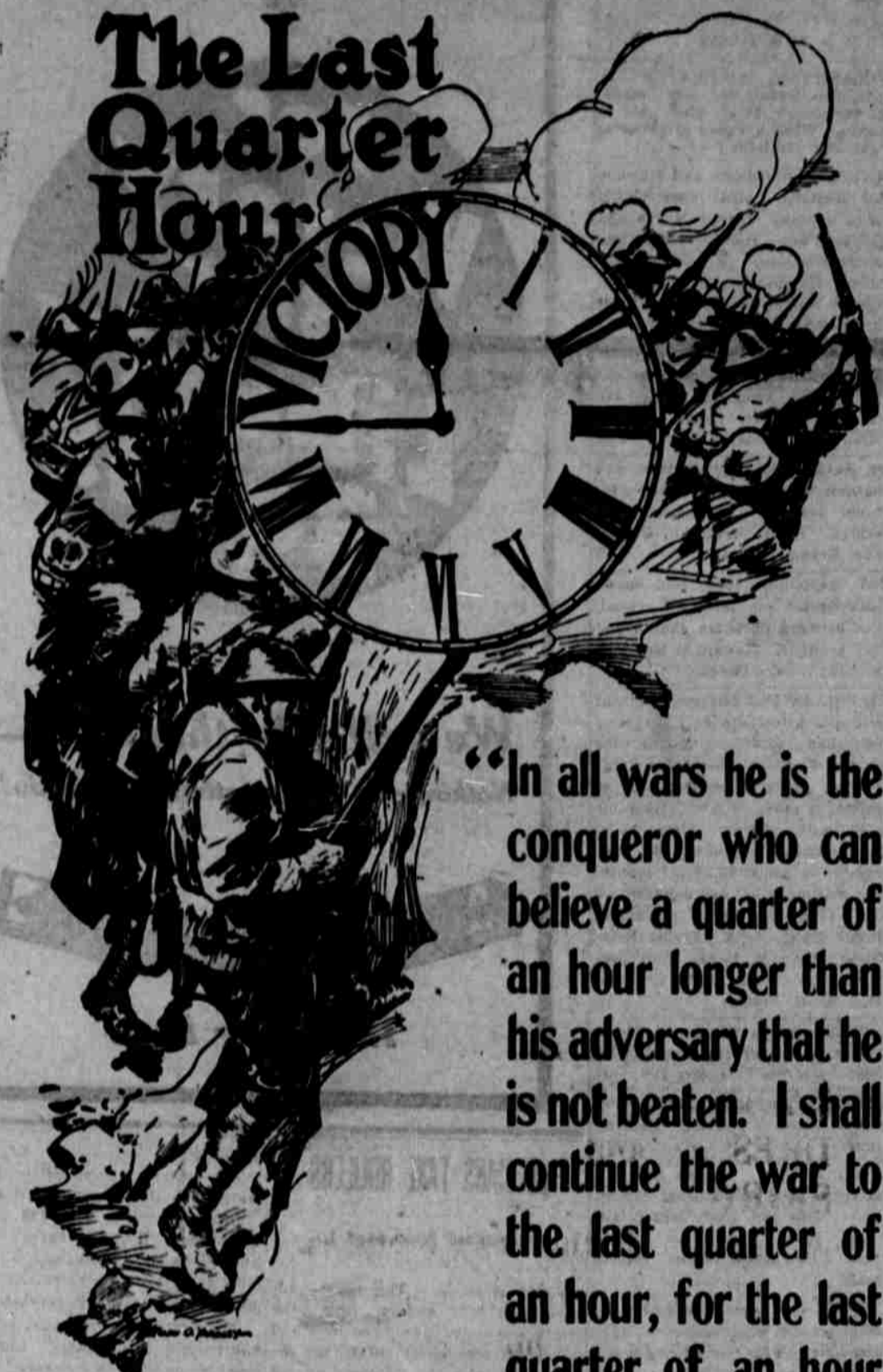
