# LOCAL INFLUENZA

A letter from Dr. A. C. Yours of the 16th received. Permit me to compliment you on your card. I think it is really the best one that I have seen. The number of new cases reported this week shows the epidemic is on the decrease, there having been reported only 21 new cases during the first four days of the week; with 2

new cases today at three o'clock And we can further decrease the number of new cases each day if wecan have the whole hearted cooperation of the public and the doctors.

Mayor Demary has no desire to institute the very drastic measures the mayors of some of the towns and cities have found it necessary to put into effect in order to control the influenza. Neither will it be necessary to place an absolute quarantine on the homes where influenza is known to exist if the doctors will put up the influenza cards which have been furnished them, and caution the family against allowing visitors to come in and directly expose themselves to the disease. And the family must follow the doctor's instructions and show some real consider ation for others.

Most of the outbreaks of influenza and the very sudden onset of a great number of new cases all within a day or so of each other can be traced directly to public dances or private dancing parties and we should deny ourselves the pleasure of dances while there is any influenza in the community.
