

WANTS U.S. TO REMOVE TRADE RESTRICTIONS

London, Feb. 27 .- (Correspondence of the Associated Press.)-Lift the economic blockade from Russia is the appeal which Alexander Berkenheim of Moscow, vicepresident and general manager of the All-Russian central union of consumers' societies, is making in England and which he intends to make soon in the United States. That is the only way, in Mr. Berkenheim's opinion, to cure Russia's troubles.
