The federal reserve bank of San Francisco, as fiscal agent of the United States government in the Twelfth federal reserve district, announces that coupon bonds or the Fourth Liberty loan as well as bonds of the other loans have been delivered to the banks through which subscription were received. Registered bonds of the Fourth Liberty loan are being delivered to subscribers as rapidly as received from the treasury department in Washington. It is anticipated that delivery of all registered bonds will be completed by April 20, 1919.
