The wicked secretary of the local soviet proposed to turn the church into a people's theatre and the priests' home fato a yetiool or a | shop but the majority of the people opposed it. <br> In November laat when the bolsheviki gained control of this distriet they arrested me and the deacon, demanding a contribution of 3,400 rubles and in case of refual I was to be horsewhipped, my possessions confiscated and I was to be deported to the Red Guard headquarters to dig trenches." <br> Mr. Galavin, a clerk of an oil comsasy, from whom the bolahevilal demanded 35,000 , rubles was horsewhipped and afterward shot. <br> When the Red Guard captured the villago of Oust Zilma, wrote the priest, "they committed all sorts of ontrages, eutting off tongues and ears and finally throwing their victima in the river." In conclusion the priest asked the archbishop not to send him back to the "frightful nightmare" at Oust Outcha. |
