NOT IN VAIN

For the last four years Memorial Day has made us catch our breath at the contrast between the past and the present. Today finds us almost incredulous as we turn from that past to our certain future.

And yet the difference is on the surface. The deeps run ever the same.

A handful of old men march today, and lay tokens of remembrance upon the graves of their comrades. A half century ago these veterans were fighting their brothers of the South or North, in their own land. The Medford delegation was then called upon and Mayor Gates responded. He heartily concurred in what Mr. Sabin and Mr. Greer had said, adding that he came to Medford to discover an ideal climate, and found it. "If I live to be 80 years old," said the mayor, "I hope to spend the balance of my days in the Rogue River valley." This brought forth a cheer, after which the little story he saved for the finale almost surpassed Mr. Sabin's bull story.

committee of 15—five from each city—was appointed to draw up the method of procedure, which will be presented to the different clubs for approval. As only four members were present from Ashland they could not guarantee approval of the plan by the Ashland Commercial club, but they themselves were heartily in favor of the move.

The committee on Grants Pass for this purpose is as follows: Geo. C. Sabin, O. S. Blanchard, Jas. T. Chinnoek, E. A. Murphy and F. S. Bramwell. Medford's committee is S. S. Smith, Robert Ruhl, J. W. Dressler, H. L. Walther and B. W. Paul. These men are to meet at Ashland, whose club will later appoint a committee, on Wednesday, June 4, at 6 p. m., and it is planned to make speedy headway in getting out the proposed literature.

After the following resolution was read by O. S. Blanchard, the meeting adjourned:

"WHEREAS the people of Jackson and Josephine counties have considered that a hard surfaced roadway, 16 feet in width, should be constructed on the Pacific highway, and the highway commission of Oregon has concurred in that view by ordering such paving.

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by a joint meeting of the Commercial Clubs of Ashland, Medford and Grants Pass, that the thanks of Southern Oregon be extended to the highway commission of Oregon for ordering such construction."

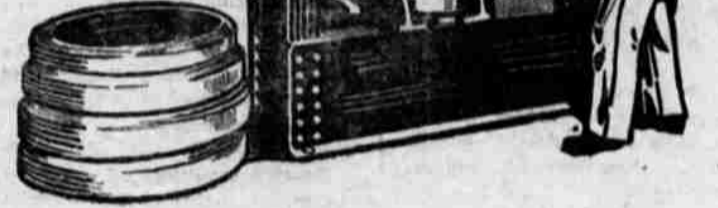

CHANGE IN TRAIN TIME EFFECTIVE ON JUNE 1

The following notice of change in mail train time at Grants Pass, effective June 1st, has been received: No. 13 (southbound), 8:22 a. m. No. 14 (northbound), 9 a. m. No. 54 (northbound); 6:15 p. m.

All mails close at the postoffice 30 minutes before train time and to insure dispatch, all outgoing mail should be deposited in the postoffice 10 minutes before closing time. This is particularly important when mail is intended for No. 54, since this train carries all the mail for the northern, eastern and central states. There has been no change of time announced for train No. 15 (southbound), the mail for which will continue to close at the postoffice at 9 p. m.

On Friday, May 30th, Memorial Day, there will be no delivery by carrier and patrons are kindly requested not to call at the office for their mail in order that the carriers may observe the day as they may desire; however, for those who might be to a loss by not receiving their mail on Memorial Day, the carrier window will be open to them from 10 to 10:30 a. m., during which time the general delivery and stamp windows will also be open.

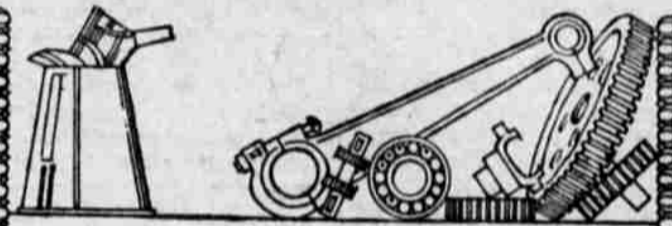
