San Francisco, Cal., June 3.—"The Palace bar turned into a soda-water and ice cream parlor—Gosh!" To men who are reaching sunset days of their lives; who were a part of the hectic period of the Comstock mining boom and other famous bonanza days in the various sections of the unfettered West with its open gambling and many famous bars and hotels it becomes an effort of the imagination to picture the transition which will occur July 1.

But the Palace hotel bar will make the change, it has just been announced. The largest and most famous of the far western institutions of that character, whose net income is said to have been in the neighborhood of \$175,000 a year, where men discussed millions over their cocktails or highballs and where many a gigantic mining, land or stock deal was consummated, will fall in line. Behind this bar hangs Maxfield's Parrish's mural decoration, "The Pled Piper of Hamelin," which cost the hotel management \$25,000. A companion piece, "Old King Cole," hangs in the Knickerbocker hotel in New York.

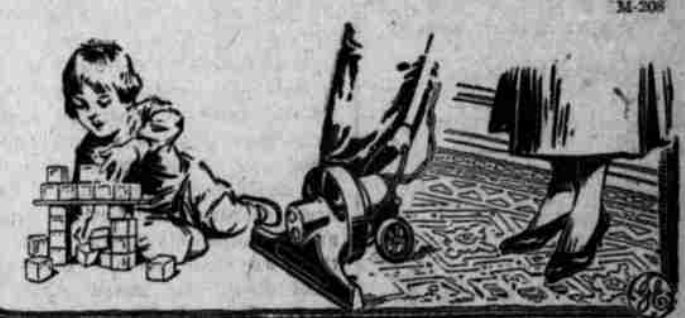
