### HEINIES WORKED HARD BUT CAUGHT IN THE ACT

Sydney, Australia, June 4.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press)—Several hundred Germans and Austrians made an attempt to escape by tunnelling from the Holdsworth concentration camp here, recently in order to foil the purpose of the Australian authorities to send them back to Germany and Austria.

The military authorities had previously notified the interned Teutons that they were soon to be returned to their native countries. Shortly before they were to be taken out of the internment camp, the authorities discovered a tunnel 150 feet long which led from one of the barracks underneath the fence enclosing the camp and thence to the surface outside. The tunnel was the work of about 150 men and apparently was begun as soon as the prisoners received warning of intention to send them home. They had planned to break free from the camp on the night before the sailing of the steamer for England.

Earth removed from the tunnel had been so distributed around the camp that it was not noticed until the tunnel was almost completed. When the tunnel was discovered the Germans made a hostile demonstration but the guards suppressed it. The prisoners watched with chagrin the filling in of the tunnel.

### PORTO RICANS PUTTING UP COMMERCIAL SCRAP

San Juan, July 12.—The Porto Rican legislature has been asked to send a commission to Washington to ask congress for a loan of \$30,000,000 and for legislation to prevent monopoly of land in Porto Rico by large corporations. It has been proposed also that the commission should ask for a preferential tariff on coffee and for the establishment of a bank for making loans to farmers.

Advocates of the proposal want the \$30,000,000 for educational purposes, irrigation, freight steamers, to pay off the island's debt and other purposes.

It is also proposed that the commission should ask congress to grant the island complete self government.

These suggestion have aroused some opposition. Representative Lastra, has declared, that the Porto Rican legislature has full authority to deal with the land monopoly question and that bills in the legislature looking to that end have been defeated.

### TWO ARE KILLED WHEN AIRPLANES COLLIDE

Little Rock, July 12.—Lieutenant T. J. Lenigan of San Francisco and Chaplain R. H. Odowd, of Brooklyn, assistant camp morale officer at Camp Pike, were instantly killed when the plane piloted by Lenigan was struck by another machine. The second machine also fell, but the occupants were uninjured.
