The French have been remarkable for their excellence in narrative, ever since the times of the fabiliaux and the old Norman romances. Somewhat of their success in this way may be imputed to the structure of their langunge, whose general currency, and whose peculiar fitness for prose composition, have been noticed from a very early period. Brunetto Latini, the master of Dante, wrote his Tesoro in French, in prescence to his own tongue, as far back as the middle of the thirteenth century, on the ground that "its speech was the most universal and most detectable of all the dislects of Europe." And Dante asserts, in his treatise on Vulgar Elegaence, that "the superiority of the French consists in its adaptation, by means of its facility and agreeableness, to narratives in prose "- W. H.
