assert that this "permanent organization" work has been nothing more nor less than a quiet campaign to nail down delegates for the late secretary of the treasury and former director-general of railroads.

It is even charged that the recent trip of Chairman Cummings and several of his aids, who took them to the Pacific coast on a tour of the country, was actually devoted largely to building political fences for McAdoo.

With reference to the reported reaction over the organization activities for McAdoo, the New York Times, administration paper, says:

"In the efforts to get delegates for Mr. McAdoo, democrats, according to the report, were told that President Wilson had received assurances from Clemenceau and Lloyd-George before leaving Europe that he would be elected the first president of the league of nations and that under the circumstances there could be no thought of a third term. Democrats who are opposed to Mr. McAdoo's candidacy have taken the ground that while it might have been well enough to boom Mr. McAdoo under these circumstances, the attitude of the United States senate toward the peace treaty and the league of nations covenant has made all efforts in that direction particularly ill-timed, in view of the fact that failure to ratify the treaty unamended al-

most certainly would force President Wilson against his will to enter next year's contest as a third-term candidate for his present office."

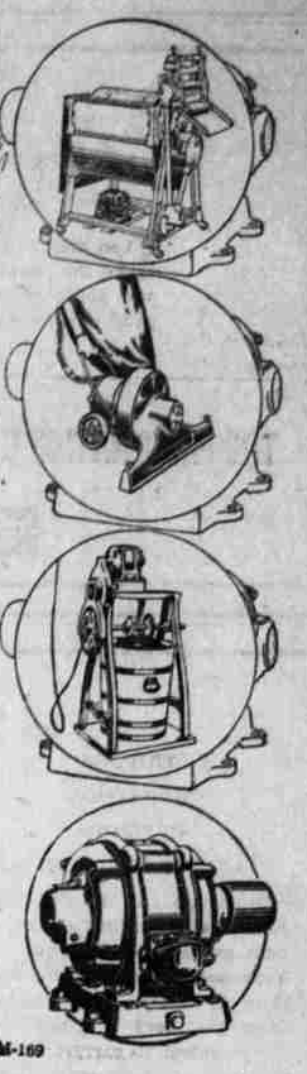
