EGG SUBSTITUTES ARE MOSTLY CAMOUFLAGE

Egg substitutes examined by the Agricultural Chemistry department of the Oregon Agricultural College are made up for the most part of corn starch colored with a yellow dye, like turmeric. One brand is put up in packages containing stightly more than an ounce of flour and a pinch of turmeric. It sells on the market at ten cents a package, which is recommended as going as far as a dozen eggs, if used with flour or Trains will run Mondays, Wednes- corn starch. Analysis shows it to be egg camouflage with a food value P.M. of less than two eggs. 
