POISONING RABBITS
Dissolve 1 ounce of strychnine sulphate in two gallons of hot water, and sprinkle over ten pounds of clean alfalfa hay leaves. Mix until all moisture is thoroughly absorbed. Should strychnine alkaloid be used one quart of vinegar should be substituted for one quart of the water in preparing the solution. While the snow is on the ground is the very best time to get the rabbits.—Farm Bureau News.
