RED CROSS SUPPLIES MEN WITH NEW FACES

Paris, Feb. 6.—The "Society of the Men with the Copper Masks" has just held its first annual convention at the Val de Grace military hospital, Paris. The society consists of French soldiers, suffering from facial wounds, who have been provided with a set of new features by the American Red Cross.

The most successful address was made by a woman's hairdresser who lost his nose through a shell explosion. As he told his comrades in a speech: "Without my nose my job was gone, for how could a noseless coiffeur hope to please women customers? Already melancholy had marked me for its own, when the mask expert took my case in hand, and so successfully, that I am now doing a rushing business in my old trade."

These American "portrait masks," which are the only ones in France, are made of light weight copper plate, enamelled in flesh tints. They conceal facial scars and hide the absence of missing features. They are an adaptation of the mask invented by Captain Derwent Wood of the British army. The work owes its origin to Mrs. Maynard Ladd, of Boston, who devised the American mask, and to Miss Marie Brent, of Columbus, Ohio, who took charge of the "portrait mask studio." Miss Brent recently married Despreaux, director of one of the most important libraries in Paris.

had been granted by vote of the people in 1918 had expired on the first of the present year without action.

Supporting the calling of the election and the granting of the franchise were Messrs. Flanagan and Lathrop, land owners, and Geo. Sorenson, representing the Irrigation & Power company. There was also a large attendance of other land owners from down the valley.

When the mayor asked if there were any present who wished to speak for the Grants Pass Irrigation district, the so-called "Southside" project, Engineer Fertig, who is here representing the Ralph Schneelock company, the purchasers of the bonds explained the situation as regards that project. He said the bonds had been purchased by his company, but that before the final and definite plan for the construction of the irrigation system could be approved, it was necessary to know whether or not the lands of the lower valley were to be included. If included, it would necessitate enlarged gates, canals, etc., making a more extensive project, though with the probable reduction in the cost per acre because of the larger acreage.

The next meeting of the council, at which the ordinance can again be called up, will be on February 19th. Attorney Hough, in speaking for the calling of the election, stated that the Irrigation & Power company would bear the expense of the election if one should be called.

PRINCE TAKES DANCE IDEAS BACK TO ENGLAND

London, Feb. 6.—"Robber" or "Paul Jones" dances are being introduced in some West End clubs and dancing halls since the Prince of Wales returned from the United States where he gave this form of dance royal approval by waiting, one-stepping and fox-trotting with no less than 50 partners at one ball.

As the name indicates, in "robber" dances, male members of the party who happen to be without partners are privileged to "cut in" on any of the more fortunate men who have partners.

In England it has been the custom for dancers to have not more than three or four partners during an evening—and more frequently only one. But Londoners are trying out the American idea and seem to like it.

TEACHERS WOULD WORK ON ARMY PAY BASIS

Pittsburg, Pa., Feb. 5.—Thirteen male teachers in the public schools of this city have made a proposition to the board of education to be put on an army basis for pay and subsistence. These teachers served with distinction in the world war, and they ask the school board to give them \$33 a month, with board, clothes and lodging furnished. They claim they do not get the equivalent of that now. As teachers their pay ranges from \$120 to \$217 a month.

WILSON AND BRYAN TOUTED BY NO. DAKOTA DEMOCRATS

Fargo, N. D., Feb. 5.—A resolution endorsing William J. Bryan for the presidential nomination on the democratic ticket was introduced at the democratic state convention here today.
