It has disturbed the peace and the happiness of the people of southern Oregon continuously because of the effort of a bunch of residents of a district far removed from the stream itself to always dictate the policy affecting the river. We had hoped till recently that there was a spark of fairness in the Medfordites, but they have proved their utter unreliability in keeping promises or in wishing to maintain friendly relations with their neighbors. They hoodwinked a few of the people of Portland, and with their connivance put over the secret "agreement" which was enacted more for political than for reasons of fish protection and conservation. Simple Cure for Hiccoughs.

This is the method of treating obstinate hiccough that Dr. D. Francisco, Vanegas employs. He describes it in the Revista de Medicina Cirurgica Practica (Madrid). The patient lies down and draws up his knees until his thighs are pressed tightly to his abdomen, the lower part of the legs being pressed against the thighs by bending the knees. The position is held for several minutes. The effect of this is to press the abdominal organs up against the diaphragm and to sustain the pressure until the diaphragm ceases its spasmodic contractions.

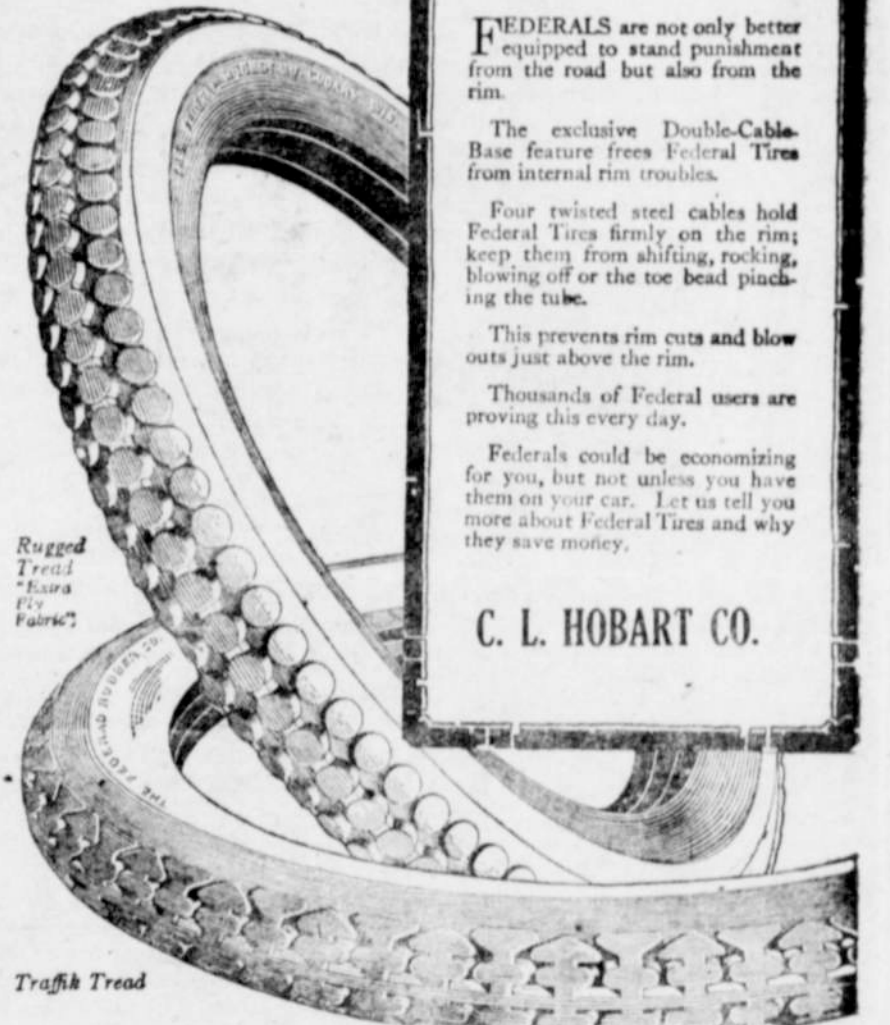
