PROVIDE WATER FOR CATTLE

Ponds, Springs, Troughs and Other Facilities Should Be Cleaned and Put in Shape.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

Before turning cattle that have been kept in the barn or lot during the winter onto a pasture a good water supply should be carefully provided for. Ponds, springs, watering troughs or other facilities for watering should be cleaned and put into shape.
